Ref: School Closure - Monday, 18th and Tuesday, 19th July

Dear Parents, Carers and Families,

I am writing to inform you that, after consulting the St Ralph Sherwin CMAT Executive Team and the local governing body, St Alban's Catholic Voluntary Academy **will be closed** on Monday, I8th July and Tuesday, I9th July due to the predicted extreme weather expected on Monday and Tuesday next week.

Following the updated 'RED' alert for predicted extreme weather by the Met Office and The Level 4 National Heat Health Warning issued by the government yesterday, we want to make sure that we do everything we can to ensure pupils and their families are safe and remain in good health during this period. This level of alert is used when a heatwave is so severe and/or prolonged that its effects extend outside the health and social care system. At this level, illness may occur among the fit and healthy, and not just in high-risk groups.

You will have heard that some schools in the area are closing and some are not. Among many other reasons for the closure, our situation at St Alban's is unique in that we have no additional ventilation systems such as air conditioning in any area of the academy. If we followed the guidance which advises closing windows and blinds, this would have a significant negative impact on temperatures in all areas of the academy and could present a serious risk to health to pupils and staff. Temperature checks even yesterday measured high in almost all areas of the school, even with mitigating factors in place.

#### **Staying Safe**

While school is closed, please ensure you protect your child by keeping air flowing wherever possible, keeping children hydrated, avoiding vigorous physical activity, encouraging children to wear loose, light coloured clothing and sunhats with wide brims, to use sunscreen, provide them with plenty of water and, if outdoors, staying in the shade as much as possible. Please ensure you keep children safe from other risks such swimming or bathing in open water to cool off and never leave anyone in a closed, parked vehicle, especially infants, young children or animals.
