Street Child by Berlie Doherty


We will be writing:

Maths


This term, we are learning about:

- Graphs and Tables




Science

This term, we are learning about:

Electricity:

- Building simple electrical Circuits.
- Using symbols for electrical components in order to draw circuit diagrams.
- Recognising whether or not a circuit will work and identifying reasons.
- Exploring voltage and resistance.



Wider Curriculum

Music - The children will be continuing to learn to play Steel Pans in preparation for their showcase later on in the half term before moving on to Glockenspiels.

Art - This term, the children are learning about T.S Lowry and his depiction of industrial landscapes.

DT - Inspired by the work of Brunel, we will be exploring bridges; how to create structures that are stable, able to bear weight and suitable for their purpose.

PE - Badminton and fitness.

Computing - Blogging - Children will identify the purpose of writing a blog and the features of successful blog writing. They will plan a blog of their own and contribute to an existing blog.

French - In this subject, the children will be learning about musical instruments. They will develop their ability to translate and construct simple pieces of text using their growing vocabulary.
